

For native German speakers, finding the right translation, from German to English or vice versa, can sometimes be a challenge. Here are some examples to help you figure out how to say certain words. And to make sure you keep yourself out of trouble.

## Practise or practice?

You may have to *practise* the difference between *practise* and *practice* before you get it right. In British English, *practise* is the verb, meaning 'to perform in order to improve', 'to carry out', or 'to be engaged in a particular occupation'. For example, 'He sat down to *practise* scales on the piano' or 'She has been *practising* law for three years.' Tip: if you can put **to** before it, it's the verb.

Practice, meanwhile, is the noun. This might mean a rehearsal or run-through, the act of doing something, or a customary action. For example, 'I need a practice session before my piano recital' or 'She was skilled in the practice of law.' Tip: if you can put **a** or **the** before it, it's a noun.

In American English, *practice* is both the verb and the noun.

## Shade or shadow?

You may wonder when you should use *shade* or *shadow* in English. The *shade* is the area away from direct sunlight. It's the darker, cooler area when it's too bright and too hot in the sun. For example, 'I want to lie in the *shade*, out of the sun.'

Shade also refers to slight differences in colours or tints, such as the famous novel by E.L. James, Fifty Shades of Grey.

A *shadow* is the dark shape made on a surface when a person or an object stands in the way of a source of light, such as the sun.
