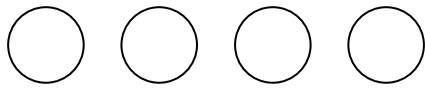
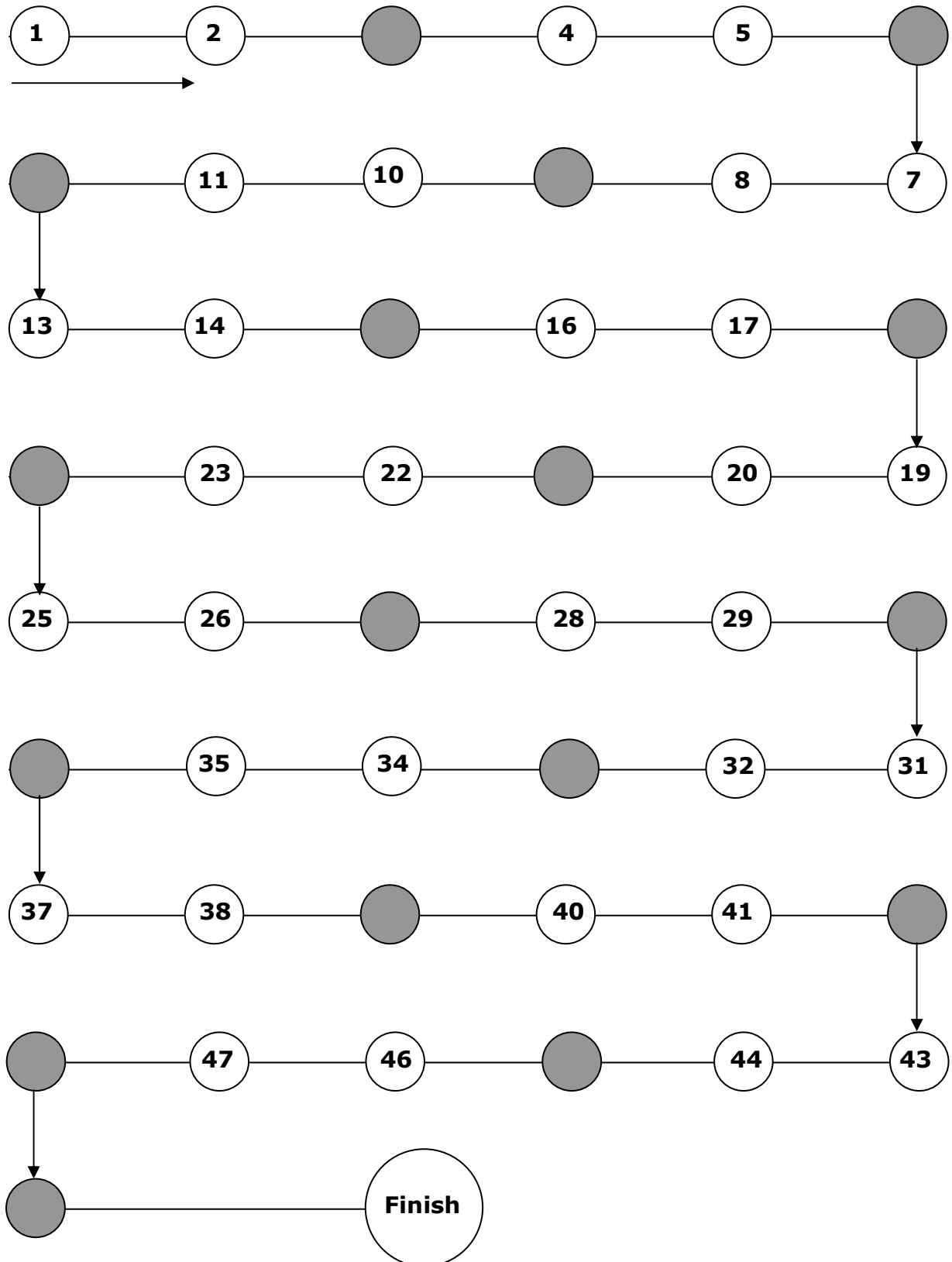

Question: We **must/have to walk, don't we?**

Translate: Ich bin seit zehn Jahren Mitglied in diesem Verein.

Translation: I have been a member of this club for ten years.

Translate: Hast du jemanden getroffen, der keine Angst hatte?

Translation: Have you met anybody who was not frightened/scared?

Question: What **does "green-eyed"** mean?

Answer: jealous (eifersüchtig, neidisch)

Translate: fliegen – flog - geflogen

Translation: to fly – flew - flown

Question: The husband of your daughter **is your...?**

Answer: son-in-law

Question: to begin – began - begun

What kind of word is "begun"?

Answer: The past participle (das Partizip Perfekt)

Put into reported speech:
Jim said: "I don't like Mondays".

Reported speech:
Jim said that he didn't like Mondays.

Question: „**I'm listening.**“ – What kind of **word is „listening“?**

Answer: The present participle (das Partizip Präsens)

Question: On which day do almost all Americans have turkey for dinner?

Answer: Thanksgiving (4th Thursday in November)

Question: Listening is wiser than speaking. –

What kind of word is "listening" / "speaking"?

Answer: The gerund (das Gerundium)

Question: The general speed limit in the USA is 55 **miles/hour**. **What's that in km/h?**

Answer: 88 km/h

Question: Name the names of at least two presidents portrayed at the Mount Rushmore National Monument.

Answer: George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt, Abraham Lincoln
