| 20. scarecrow -     | a model of a person dressed in old clothes and put in a field of growing crops to frighten birds away |
| 21. evidence -      | facts that give reason to believe that something is true  |
| 22. to realise -    | to understand a situation, sometimes suddenly   |
| 23. desperately -   | extremely or very much  |
| 24. guilt -         | a feeling of worry that you have because you have done something wrong                                |
