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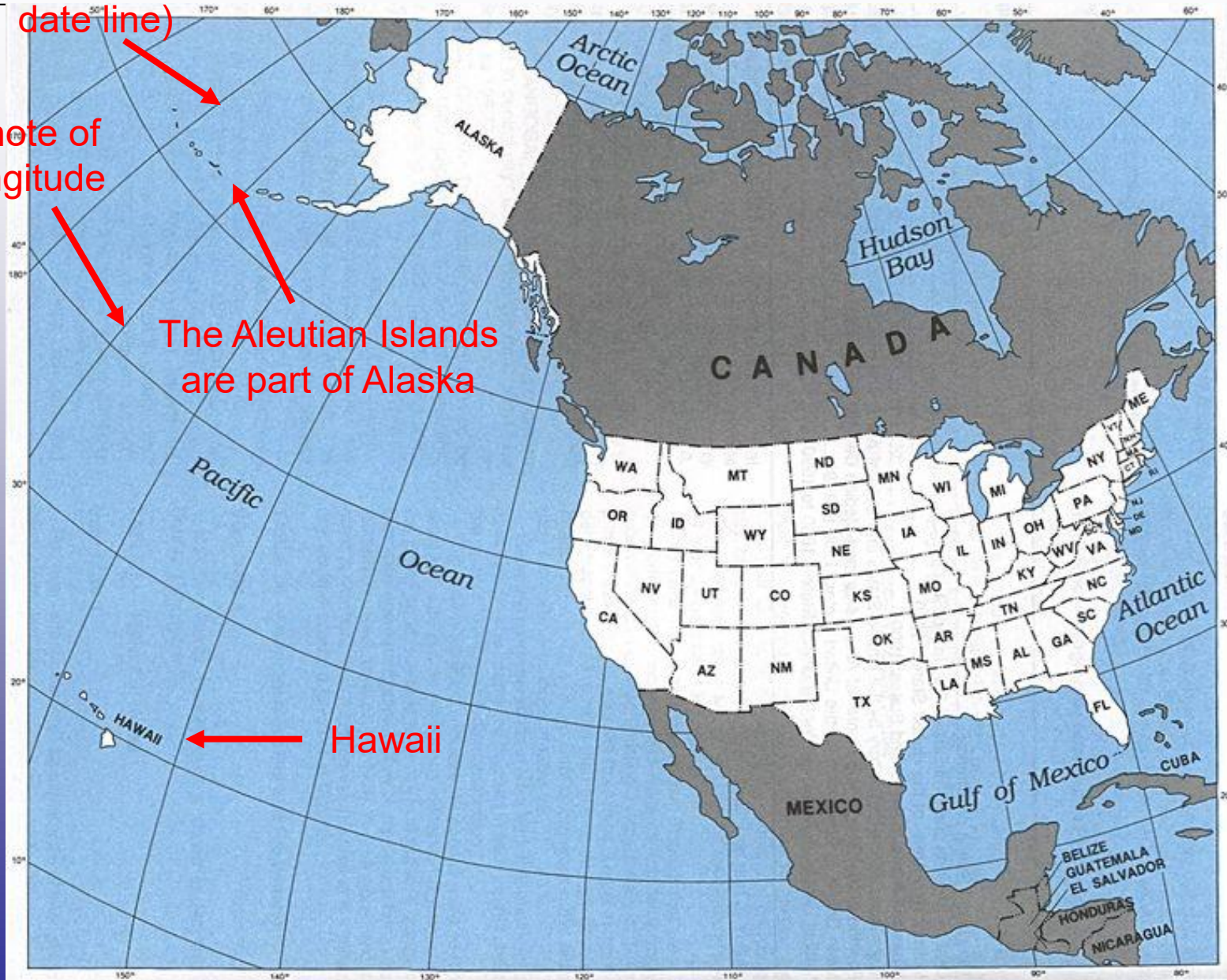

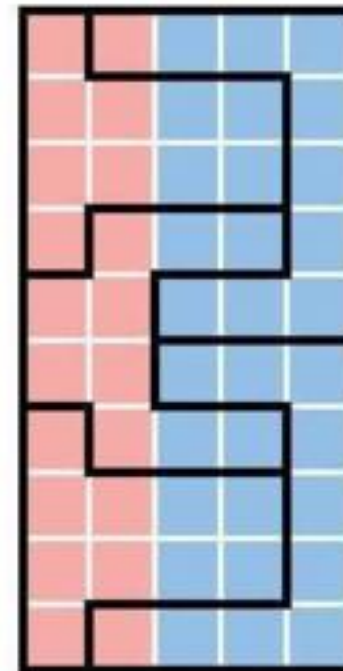
Introduced in 1812 by Massachusetts Governor Elbridge *Gerry*
