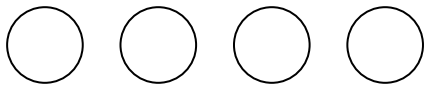
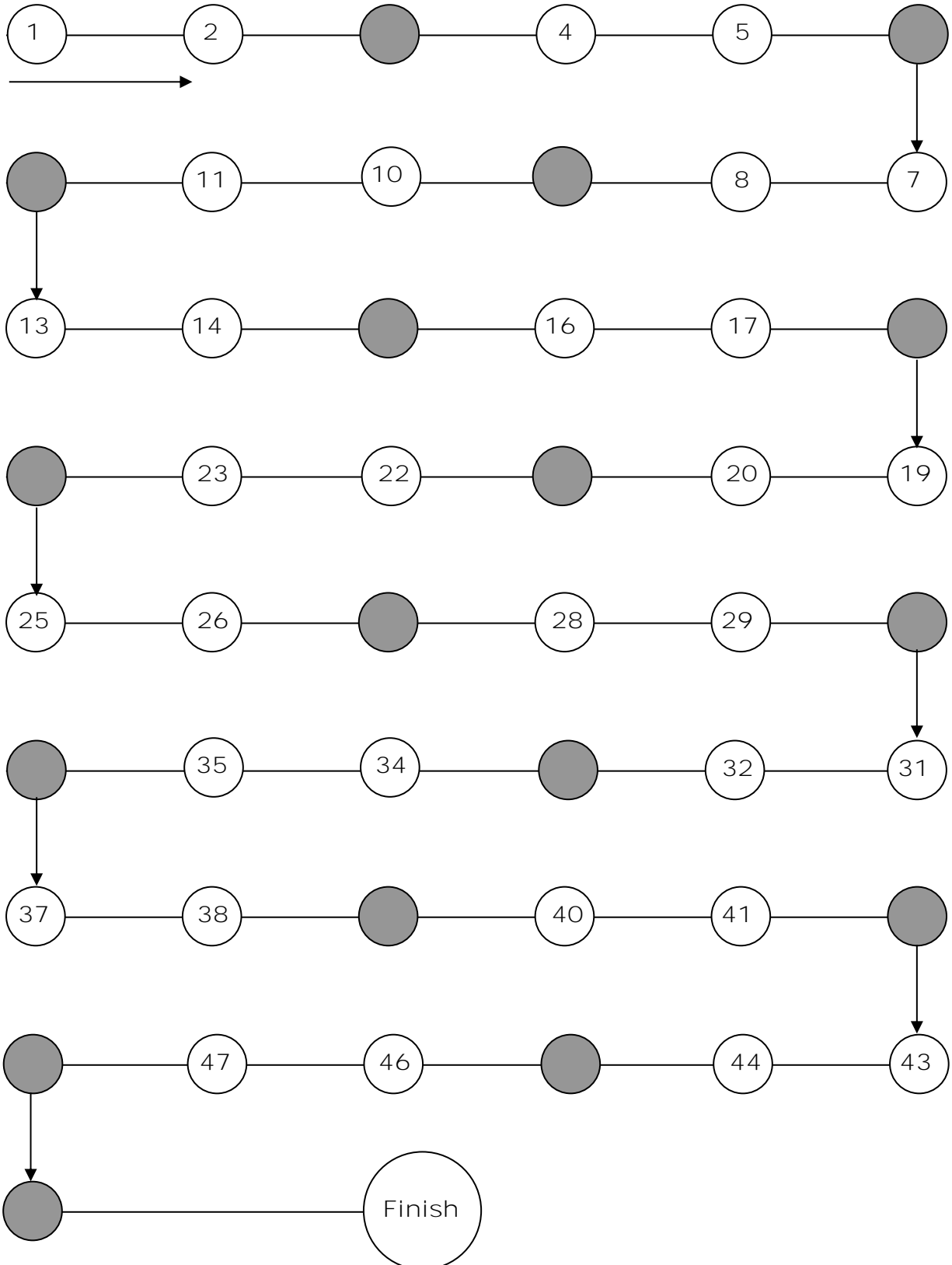

Question: What **does "green-eyed"** mean?

Answer: jealous (eifersüchtig, neidisch)

Translate: beginnen – begann - begonnen

Translation: to begin – began - begun

Question: The husband of your daughter **is your...?**

Answer: son-in-law

Question: to begin – began - begun

What kind of word is "begun"?

Answer: The past participle (das Partizip Perfekt)

Translate: Pfingsten

Translation: Pentecost, Whitsun

Question: „I'm listening." – What kind of **word is „listening"?**

Answer: The present participle (das Partizip Präsens)

Question: On which day do almost all Americans have turkey for dinner?

Answer: Thanksgiving (4th Thursday in November)

Question: Listening is wiser than speaking. –

What kind of word is "listening" / "speaking"?

Answer: The gerund (das Gerundium)

Question: What is the Scottosh word for *mountain*?

Answer: ben

Put into the passive voice: What did he tell you?

Answer: What were you told by him?

Put into the passive voice: Sarah will drive the car.

Answer: The car will be driven by Sarah.

Put into the passive voice: We are making preparations.

Answer: Preparations are being made by us.
